COVID Guidelines

A range of COVID restrictions continue to impact our normal practices.

Student illness and absences:

Students who are unwell with even the mildest symptoms should stay at home until symptoms clear. If a student develops symptoms while at school, parents or carers will be called to collect the student. Students with flu-like symptoms are not return to school until they have received a negative COVID-19 test result which is received and sighted by the school. Flu-like symptoms include:

- fever (37.5 or higher)
- cough
- sore throat
- shortness of breath (difficulty breathing)
- runny nose
- loss of taste
- loss of smell.

It is important that you inform the office of the nature of an absence. If a student is sick, we ask that you inform the office of details of the symptoms the child has.

Parents and carers on school site

Parents and carers are now allowed on school site where necessary. Parents and carers are also now allowed to attend school assemblies and other school events, however must adhere to physical distancing and hygiene guidelines.

All visitors to a school site must comply with sign-in arrangements. This includes the requirement to s^1 ign the school sign in sheet where they acknowledge that they will comply with the COVID-19 requirements for visitors each time they visit.

Visitors must also check in using the Service NSW QR code.
